1. Call to Order

Quorum being present, the Chair, Jackie Poirier, called the meeting to order and welcomed Kevin McCann to his first meeting.

The Chair acknowledged that in Nova Scotia, we are all Treaty People. We recognize the land upon which we work, live and learn is the unceded territory and ancestral homeland of the Mi'kmaq Nation. Our relationship is based on a series of Peace and Friendship treaties between the Mi'kmaq Nation and the Crown, dating back to 1725. She also noted that February is African Heritage Month and throughout the month, NSCC is celebrating the contributions and legacy of people of African descent in Nova Scotia and Canada. NSCC recognizes African Nova Scotians as a distinct group who arrived here 400 years ago. From that time on, they have contributed to the infrastructure and economic wealth of the towns and cities they helped to build, but from which they could not benefit.

She reminded Governors that we act in the best interest of the College, we demonstrate good judgement and act in an ethical manner, maintain confidentiality and comply with the Board's By-Laws and policies. She noted we encourage diverse conversation but leave with one voice.

6. Executive Committee Update

Foundation Update

Don Bureaux welcomed Ashley Power, Executive Director, NSCC Foundation to the meeting and noted she would provide a brief update on the Foundation in Gerry Post's absence. Don provided words of appreciation and gratitude to Ashley for her work. She began by referencing the report that was included in the meeting package. Ashley spoke about the work before the Foundation and Alumni team looking at how to come together with the college in a more cohesive way to focus on strategic challenges and opportunities together. She noted that 1.5M is in the door to date and \$5M are out in asks for the Sydney Waterfront Campus campaign. She concluded by providing details on the inaugural Alumni Awards taking place this April. She provided a confidential sneak peek at the four recipients for this year.



Finance, Audit & Risk Committee

Diane MacConnell-Cameron provided an update on the recent committee meeting. She noted the external auditors joined and provided a review of their plan. Bruce Spares, Director, Internal Audit presented his audit plan. Derek McCurdy, Chief Information Officer, presented the Digital Innovation Technology report which was included with the meeting materials for information. The Stat Liabilities and Third Quarter Financial Report were presented. She indicated the Q3 for year end is still showing a small surplus. Don referenced during Derek's presentation he also spoke about the need to implement a new ERP and the substantial costs involved. He noted this will be a big conversation to continue.

On-Campus Housing Update

He indicated the Kingstec Housing project is the furthest along of the next four campus housing with plans to break ground in the spring. He did include the ground breaking could be pushed to the fall. Don also spoke briefly about the evolving discussions around the Institute of Technology Campus housing and possibility of including several floors as learning spaces.

Programs Committee

Andrew Lafford, Vice President, Academic provided an update. He noted several items have already been managed during the in-camera portion. He spoke about several section deferral changes of which some were tied to Trades 260. Those sections moved out a month or two. He referred to a presentation by institutional research on graduate follow up stats.
