



CONNECTIONS RUN DEEP FOR ALUM, DONOR, VOLUNTEER

Julianne Misner's NSCC connections run deep.

She graduated from two programs at Kingstec Campus and after several years in education and employment counselling - often working with people hoping to attend NSCC - now works at Annapolis Valley Campus as a Program Assistant with Achieve.

She's also a member of the NSCC Foundation Board of Directors and a donor to and supporter of Make Way.

"I've seen how financial aid and alternative funding does make a huge difference," says Julianne. "A relatively small amount can be the difference between a student being able to stick with their education, or having to leave."

She says it's been great to see the community rally around the Annapolis Valley Campus, which includes sites in Middleton and the Centre of Geographic Sciences in Lawrencetown.

"It allows both parties to reach out and lend a hand to each other - and to students - so we can enhance what the future looks like and add some light to that."

FOSTERING MARINE ENGINEERS

The Canadian Institute of Marine Engineering Scholarship is helping foster the next generation of marine engineers at NSCC.

That includes recipient Matthew Devoe, who says he was "happy and appreciative" for the bursary, which helped him "to focus on things other than expenses."

The Marine Engineering Technology grad from the Nautical Institute at Strait Area Campus in Port Hawkesbury has always been interested in ships and their inner workings.

"I love getting my hands dirty and I knew this career path would allow me to do that," he says.

ENACTUS BOOSTS STUDENT SATISFACTION

Sam MacKenzie is passionate about helping people, which is what drew her to enroll in the Practical Nursing program at NSCC's Pictou Campus.

It's also why she joined the Enactus team at her campus. "It really aligns with my values," she says of the global community of student and business leaders committed to shaping a better, more sustainable world through entrepreneurial action.

Enactus is one of the extraordinary learning opportunities funded in part by generous donors to Make Way - The Campaign for NSCC.


SIBLINGS HONOUR FATHER'S LEGACY

Som Makkar taught his children the importance of education, the value of dreaming big, and the imperative of giving back.

That's the driving force behind the establishment of the Som Makkar Education Award, a new bursary fund established at NSCC Truro Campus by Raj Makkar, his brother Dr. Anil Makkar, and their sister, Dr. Nina Makkar.

"We are big believers in education, in the power it has," says Raj, a volunteer with the local Make Way Campaign. "It is always with you - every step of your life."

Raj and his siblings have committed \$7,500 over five years to fund an annual \$1,500 bursary to help a student in financial need pay their tuition.



It's a fitting legacy for their father, a teacher who firmly believed in the transformative power of education.

"That is what Make Way is all about - believing in and supporting education and creating opportunities for youth and individuals in our community," Raj says.

"That young person will forever remember that people helped him and he'll help others. And that's the seed you plant."

Rachelle came to Canada from the Philippines nine years ago, following a career in information technology providing software installation and support to banks.


But after waiting for permanent-residency status for three years, her skills were too outdated for the workforce.

URGENT AID KEEPS STUDENT MOTORING TO SCHOOL

As a Student Association representative at Burridge Campus in Yarmouth, Elisha Monteith had positive feelings about Make Way - The Campaign for NSCC, and specifically the Urgent Aid Fund, which helps students in dire financial need.

“I thought, ‘How wonderful to have that there for students, as a back-up,’” says the single mother of two boys, who is enrolled in NSCC’s Social Services program.

Then Elisha had to move unexpectedly, and needed winter tires for her daily commute to the campus.

“I just couldn’t navigate it. I didn’t have the funds. But if I didn’t get the tires, I wouldn’t be able to get to school,” she recalls.

Fortunately, Urgent Aid was available.

“There was no shame, no stigma, and it made a world of difference,” says Elisha.



“For individuals who want to join us in learning, financial barriers are often a reality. We want to help remove some of those barriers so that people can flourish. Make Way is an opportunity for our communities to invest in our future, and invest in individuals who want to make a better life for themselves and their families. LIMITLESS - AN OPPORTUNITY FOR TRANSFORMATION

It’s a startling statistic. Approximately 75 per cent of offenders in Canadian correctional institutions are identified as employment challenged. When released, there’s a high risk those same individuals will reoffend.

That’s where Limitless, a new NSCC program funded by The Windsor Foundation, comes in.

“We have recently begun delivering education programming within Nova Scotia’s provincial prison system, with the goal of enabling incarcerated youth from diverse backgrounds to bridge to a core NSCC program,” explains Jill Provoe, Dean, School of Access at NSCC.

Once their sentence is complete, participants will be able to continue their education with support from a \$1,500 bursary, as well as career development and life skills. They will also be part of a student works program that will allow them to work flexible hours, at their campus, in their field of study. Those wages will cover the remaining balance of their tuition.

“Numerous studies attest to the power of education in terms of reducing the risk of reoffending,” says Jill. “We are very excited to have this opportunity, thanks to The Windsor Foundation, to offer this potentially life-changing program.”



SPONSOR SENDS STUDENT TO NATIONAL CONFERENCE

Working in a predominately male industry can be daunting, but Diandra Buttazzoni, a Marine Geomatics student at NSCC’s Centre of Geographic Sciences, saw it as an opportunity.

“Women are underrepresented in the hydrographic industry, especially in marine geomatics,” says Diandra. “The issue may not have stopped me, but it is certainly something women think about before considering the industry.”

As part of the Women in Hydrography program, Diandra was sponsored to attend the 2018 Joint Canadian Hydrographic and National Surveyors’ Conference by QPS Canada, and paired with a female mentor from the QPS United States office.

“I’m very grateful for the opportunity,” she says.
