



# International Student Guide: Co-op Work Permit Application

***Apply for your co-op work permit as soon as possible—at least 4-6 months before you are scheduled to begin your work term. You cannot start your work experience without a permit.***

***Processing time can vary, and it is better to have the permit early.***

The application for a Co-op Work Permit is completed online.

**You may be required to submit biometrics for this application if you have not done so already in a previous application.** If you need to provide biometrics, IRCC will notify you after you submit your application online. There is a fee of \$85 for this process.

## Medical Exam Requirement:

Depending on your job, you may be required to provide medical exam results for your work permit. If your job is in any of the fields below, or if you have lived in a designated country before coming to Canada, you may need to complete a medical exam:

- agriculture related fields
- public health
- health sciences (e.g., health care workers, clinical laboratory workers)
- education (ECE, primary or secondary)

The exam must be conducted by **an IRCC-approved panel physician.**

If you apply before coming to Canada, the doctor will send the full results to IRCC.

Ask the doctor for a copy of your medical exam report ('e-medical') as you may need it for further applications.

If your exam results are older than 12 months and you require one for your work experience, you will need a new exam. You can find an IRCC-approved panel physician using this tool:

## Application Instructions:

### Log into your IRCC account:

If you are a new user, you will need to register. Your Client ID from your Study Permit is required to complete the registration. <http://www.cic.gc.ca/english/e-services/mycic.asp>

After signing in, click on **“Apply to Come to Canada,”** and choose **“Visit visa, study and/or work permit.”**

### Complete the questionnaire:

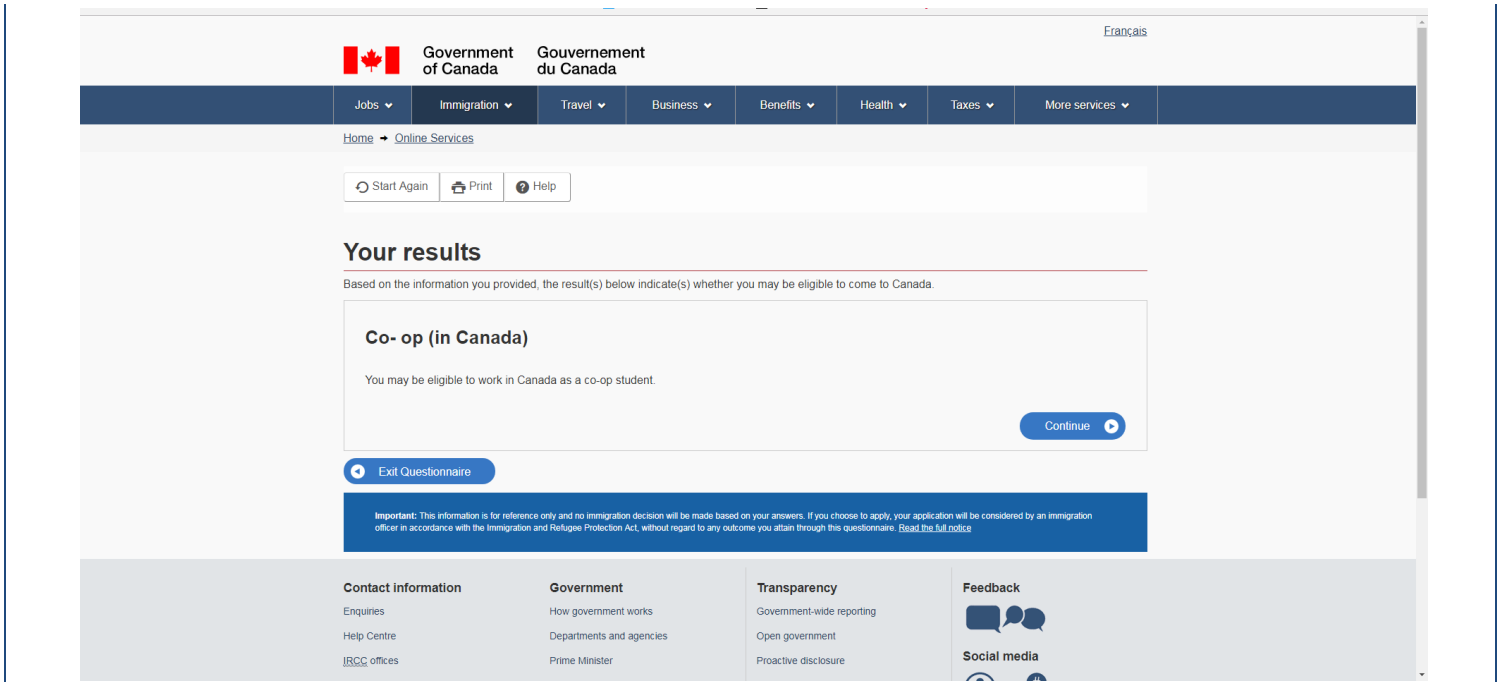

(Depending on your country of origin, you may also see the option of “Temporary Resident Visa”. Do **not** click “Continue” for this)



Click **“Continue”** on the next screen to generate your document checklist.

The toll-free number is 1-888-242-2100.</p> <p>Then, create a Word document with the following information:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>date and country where the exam was conducted and the UMI# given by IRCC.</li> </ul> <p>Your online application will prompt you to submit this confirmation of medical examination.</p>

<b>Signature</b>	<i>You do not need to print and sign the form – instead, click "Validate" and then save this version (the last page should be a bar code). This is the version that you will upload online.</i>

"What are you applying for?" = **"Temporary residence (visiting, studying, working)"**
