

In 2021, EduNova celebrated five years of the Study & Stay™ program, with a retention rate of 89% of participants (including from NSCC) living and working in Nova Scotia after graduation. In 2022, the program will be expanded to create more opportunities for international students studying in Nova Scotia.

#### Internationalization benefits 2021/22

#### Goal

Enhanced quality and increased participation in international learning programs for students



#### Results

- Received \$1 million in funding to support student learning abroad through the Government of Canada Global Skills Opportunity program;
- 80 students participated in 10 projects within nine countries around the world;



- 56 students identified as being part of a target group (low-income, Indigenous and students with disabilities);
- 18 employees led and supported students on projects;
- All Black Nova Scotian program launched in St. Kitts & Nevis;
- Online pre-departure course upgraded and streamlined; and
- New risk management strategy developed and committee created including NSCC employees from several departments.

### **Technical Assistance Projects**

#### Internationalization benefits 2021/22

#### Goal

More externally funded international technical assistance projects in target regions that create international learning opportunities for employees and students



#### **Results**

- Hybrid planning and implementation of project activities
  - Design of two online technical training courses for local participants in a project in Kenya
  - 200 + participants from Chile and Peru in six on-site and virtual teacher and technical training workshops
  - 50 + participants in on-site and virtual capacity building activities in Kenya as part of the Communications Component for Promotion of Youth Employment and Vocational Training

- Development of a new two-year program as part of a renewable energy and energy efficiency project in Belize including 30 + participants in 19 virtual and 9 onsite training sessions as well as development of a new marketing and branding toolkit
- 30 + participants in capacity building webinars as part of the SAGE Marketing Consultancy
- Development of short and fulltime GIS courses as part of a new two-year environmental technician program in Grenada
- 8 active externally funded technical assistance projects in the Caribbean, East Africa, and Latin America with 25 international partner institutions and 8 Canadian partner colleges

### Immigrant and International Student Experience

#### Internationalization benefits 2021/22

#### Goal

Enhance the immigrant and international student experience at NSCC



#### Results

- 718 international students at NSCC (as of October 1, 2021)
- Top 5 countries: India, Brazil, South Korea, China, Nigeria
- 1746 volunteer hours, 123 activities and 62 active members of the NSCC International Student Ambassador (ISA) program
- 64% of international students at NSCC have participated in at least 1 ISA event
- 22 NSCC Study & Stay <sup>™</sup> graduates employed in Nova Scotia
- NSCC Pathway to Stay program had 90 registrants and collaboration with EAP program and EAL for ALP to offer some modules during their career exploration units

- 206 employees participated in training, workshops, and professional development related to fostering a welcoming community for immigrant and international students
- 9 Cultural Coaches sessions featuring 18 countries
